Towards longevity, redefining health and well-being

Held under the patronage of **His Highness Sheikh Khaled bin Mohamed bin Zayed Al Nahyan, Crown Prince of Abu Dhabi and Chairman of Abu Dhabi Executive Council**, Abu Dhabi Global Health Week brought together global leaders, medical pioneers, policymakers, investors, and innovators from across the global Health ecosystem to shape the future of health.

Abu Dhabi Global Health Week 2025 (ADGHW), hosted by the Department of Health - Abu Dhabi, marked a pivotal moment in shaping the future of global health. With more than 14,290 attendees, 271 speakers, and 1,295 delegates from 95 countries, the event tackled the world's most urgent health challenges, driving bold conversations around the core theme: **Towards Longevity, Redefining Health and Well-Being.**

During the official opening ceremony of Abu Dhabi Global Health Week, entrepreneur and publisher AlDhabi AlMheiri speaks with H.E. Ibrahim Al Jallaf, Executive Director of Digital Health at the Department of Health – Abu Dhabi, about her vision for the future of healthcare. In a symbolic dialogue with her "future self," she reflects the ambition and hope of the UAE's youth.

Across three dynamic days, attendees engaged in visionary keynotes, high-level panel discussions, interactive workshops, and a vibrant exhibition showcasing breakthroughs in medical technology, digital health, and sustainable healthcare models.

Beyond the sharing of ideas and collaborative learning, ADGHW 2025 also witnessed the signing of 33 MoUs and 9 major launches and announcements, consolidating the event as a launchpad for strategic partnerships, investment opportunities, and real-world solutions aimed at building more resilient, equitable health systems.














Future of health on display: ADGHW global exhibition






Visitors by region


Visitors by seniority

Major initiatives announced at ADGHW 2025

Abu Dhabi Global Health Week served as a launchpad for transformative collaborations and bold new frameworks set to redefine the future of health. From pioneering research institutes to global declarations, the following initiatives reflect the event's enduring impact on healthcare innovation and partnership.

A groundbreaking 'Declaration on Longevity and Precision Medicine' was launched, marking a historic milestone in transforming healthcare delivery and research. As the first initiative of its kind - and developed in collaboration with leading global health organisations, academic institutions, and industry pioneers - the Declaration outlines key principles to accelerate advancements in precision medicine and longevity science.

The Abu Dhabi Department of Health (DoH), pioneered a collaborative approach to 'Responsible AI in Healthcare' at the Health Leaders Roundtable, which convened global leaders to address the challenges and governance principles for integrating AI in healthcare.

The DoH, ADIO, MBZUAI, and Hub71 joined forces under the newly launched HELM cluster - led by the Abu Dhabi Department of Economic Development (ADDED) - to advance Aldriven breakthroughs in medicine.

DoH and ADIO signed an MoU with GSK to establish a Multi-omics Research Institute in Abu Dhabi, advancing oncology-focused precision medicine and diversifying global genomic research to improve cancer outcomes.

In another landmark MoU, DoH, PureHealth, Khalifa University, Illumina, M42, IHLAD, and NYU Abu Dhabi formed a collaborative framework to develop genomic infrastructure, launch R&D initiatives in advanced therapeutics, and integrate precision medicine into clinical care - strengthening AI and digital platforms and building local talent.





Health Leaders Roundtable

Convened by the Department of Health - Abu Dhabi and PwC, this closed-door session brought together over 40 leaders from ministries of health, regulatory bodies, health systems, academia, and industry.

Centred on the question: "What conditions helped or hindered you in innovating with or adopting AI?", the discussion explored how governance can unlock responsible AI adoption in healthcare.

Key outcomes:

- 1. Collaboration must be embedded in governance: Collaboration is essential, not optional. Governance frameworks must formalise shared ownership, codevelopment, and joint accountability across stakeholders, from policymakers and providers to developers and patients.
- 2. Governance should be flexible and adapt to different contexts: Rigid, one-size-fits-all regulation is a barrier. Principle-based governance should provide guardrails for safety and ethics while allowing flexibility based on stakeholder roles, local context, and the specific Al application.
- 3. Data must be treated as a shared strategic asset: Data is central to trust, equity, and innovation. Governance should promote secure, standardised, and interoperable data ecosystems designed for system-wide transformation, not just technical compliance.

- 4. Trust starts with data and does not end there: Trust must be reinforced at every stage of the Al lifecycle through transparency, communication, and visible oversight that ensures continuous safety and accountability.
- **5. Governance should enable safe testing, prototyping, and scale:** Governance must create conditions for experimentation and iteration. This includes supporting controlled testing environments and adaptive regulatory pathways.
- 6. Governance must align with real-world needs and priorities: Al should solve real clinical and operational challenges.
 Governance must ensure tools are designed with end-users and system needs in mind not just technological capability.
- 7. Incentives and investment must support innovation: Outdated funding and reimbursement models often stifle progress. Governance must address these barriers and direct investment toward infrastructure, workforce, and validation.
